CF Psychology offers remote online educational psychology assessments for all age groups across the UK.

They work closely with many university students, who require an assessment to evidence for Disabled Student Allowance (DSA) or apprenticeship-funded support and exam concessions (e.g. extra time in exams) for undergraduate and postgraduate study.

The assessment is SASC (The Specific Learning Difficulties Assessment Standards Committee) compliant and identifies the four specific learning difficulties recognised by SASC:

- Dyslexia
- Dyscalculia
- Dyspraxia
- ADHD (if a referral has already been made by a medical practitioner)

All assessments take place online via video conferencing.

## Cost



The average SpLD assessment in the UK for adults costs around £350-£500 depending on the assessor.

At University of the Built Environment we offer to pay £200 towards an assessment, with the student paying the remaining £150.

You will be invited to book your assessment through CF Psychology's online portal and asked to pay £150 towards your assessment

If the £150 student contribution is a barrier to booking your assessment, you might be eligible to apply for the **Financial Support Fund** or **Disabled and Mental Health Student Success Fund**.

Please be aware if you cancel you will be responsible for the cancellation fee of £75 alongside the £150 assessment fee.

# Process for Assessment

1

**Contact the Disability team** to register your interest in an SpLD/Non-medical ADHD assessment.

2

We may ask you to complete a pre-assessment, such as a QuickScreen Dyslexia screener, which can help identify whether an SpLD assessment is the right option for you. We may need confirmation that you have spoken to a medical practitioner about ADHD, if applicable.

3

We will review the results of your pre-assessment and send you a consent form, confirming we can pass your details onto CF Psychology.

4

Once you have returned the consent form, the Disability Team can process your referral to CF Psychology. We may discuss interim support options for you whilst you wait for your assessment.

5

CF Psychology will email you within 1 week of referral with pre-assessment paperwork and instructions on how to book your assessment. You will be asked to pay the £150 student contribution at this point.

6

You will then undergo your SpLD/Non-Medical ADHD assessment with CF Psychology. You should receive your report a few weeks after your assessment. A copy is also sent to the University.

7

Once you have received your report, please book a follow up call with your Disability Adviser to discuss next steps and support.
